Club Development

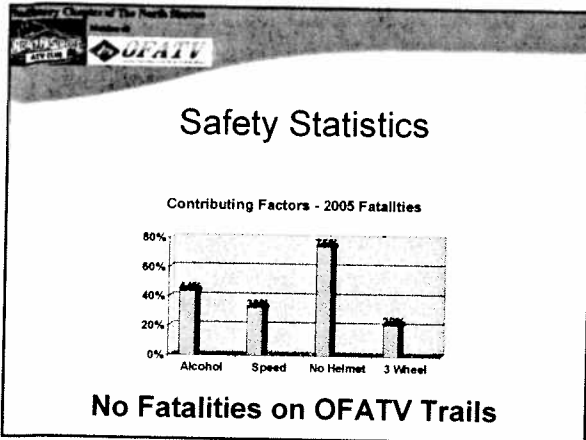
- OFATV Clubs are bound by our policies and guidelines such as:

Trail Insurance

- **\$5 Million** coverage for registered Landowners, OFATV, and the member ATV Club at no direct cost to Landowner, clubs and affiliated groups or communities.
- Provides Landowner 3rd party coverage!
- Possibly the most comprehensive trail insurance available in Ontario.



Riders Age?

- Road Access - Requires an ATV operator to be a Licensed driver Therefore they must be 16 years of age or older
- (G2 or M) Classification
- Trail Access – Must be a minimum of 12 years old (same as Snowmobiles)

Keeping Communities Happy!

- Operational Speed and Hours of use
- Maximum 50 km/hr !
- 20 km/hr where posted speed is 50 km/hr or less
- Municipalities have the ability to place by-laws to limit the hours of use

Economic Benefits

In 2005 Canadians Spent \$3.3 billion on ATV activities

- There were 975,000 operating ATV's
- 24.9% was spent on accommodations / meals
- 25.4% of expenditures was for new ATV's
- 24,000 Canadians are involved serving ATV user
- Total ATV sales 2006 were 89,006 units
- Total number of ATV's currently in Canada is in excess of 1 million
