Background:

Tenders for Contract 2005-48, Solid Waste Processing Services: Area 2 and Area 4 were opened at the Tender Opening Committee on Friday, December 9, 2005, and the following bidders submitted tenders:

The tenders were reviewed and two tenders corrected for mathematical errors. As there was an irregularity that prevented the award of the contract to the lowest bidder, this is presented to Council for approval as required in Purchasing By-Law 2003-300 Section 7©.

Award to the lowest compliant bidder, Waste Management is recommended. The contract is for a ten-year period, commencing in April 2006. This a budgeted item and will not impact the net current budget.

The above-noted contract is one of three collection contracts to be awarded. The other two contracts were awarded to Waste Management of Canada Corporation and to William Day Construction as being the lowest bidders without irregularities.
