- ✓ Council's approved initiatives are funded within the budget
- ✓ Legislative and contractual obligations are satisfied
- ✓ Council approved service and standard levels are maintained
- ✓ Cost of providing services is minimized
- ✓ Other revenue sources are maximized to minimize impact on property taxes





#### **How 2007 Operating Dollars are Spent**




#### **Sources of Revenues 2007 Budget**

Taxes (based on a 4.2% municipal tax increase) on a Home With an Assessed Value of \$120,000








### **Five Year Capital Budget History**



## Impact of a 3.6% Property Tax Increase on a Residential Home

(inclusive of Education Tax rates)

| Assessment                  | \$120,000 | \$180,000 |
|-----------------------------|-----------|-----------|
| <b>Total Property Taxes</b> | \$2,299   | \$3,448   |
| Annual Increase             | \$80      | \$120     |
| Monthly Increase            | \$6.67    | \$10.00   |

Does not take into account the effects of area rating.



#### **Water and Wastewater User Fee**

User Fee Increase 4.9%

Annual Increase \$48

Monthly Increase \$4
