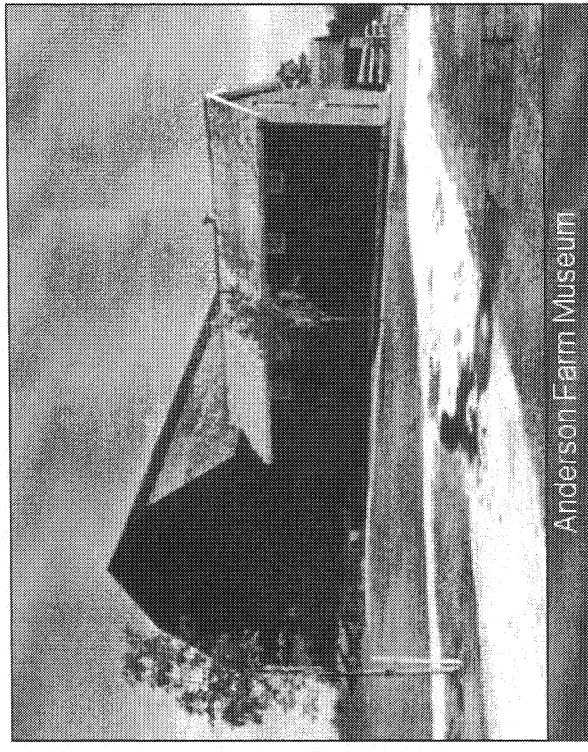
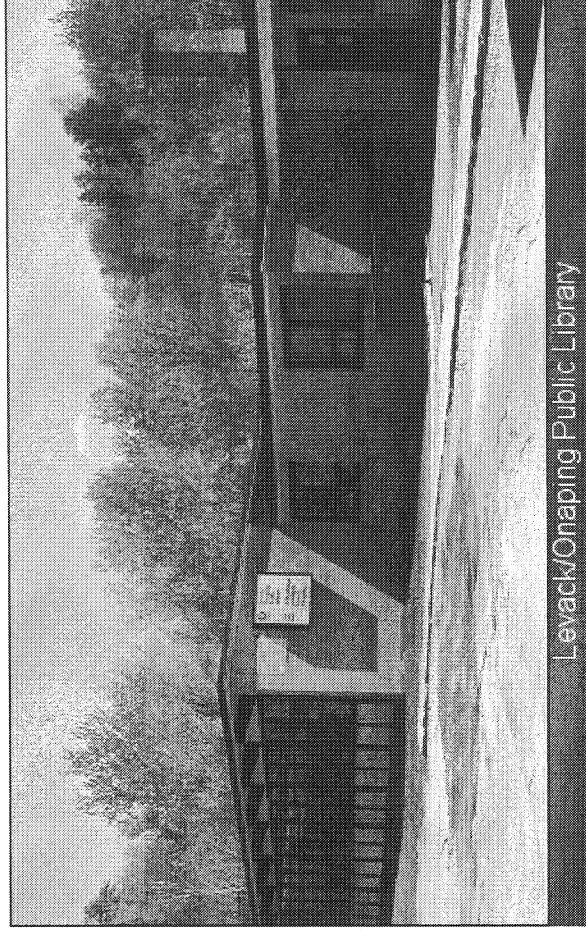

Mandate

- To provide convenient access to a broad range of municipal services from 6 Citizen Service Centres

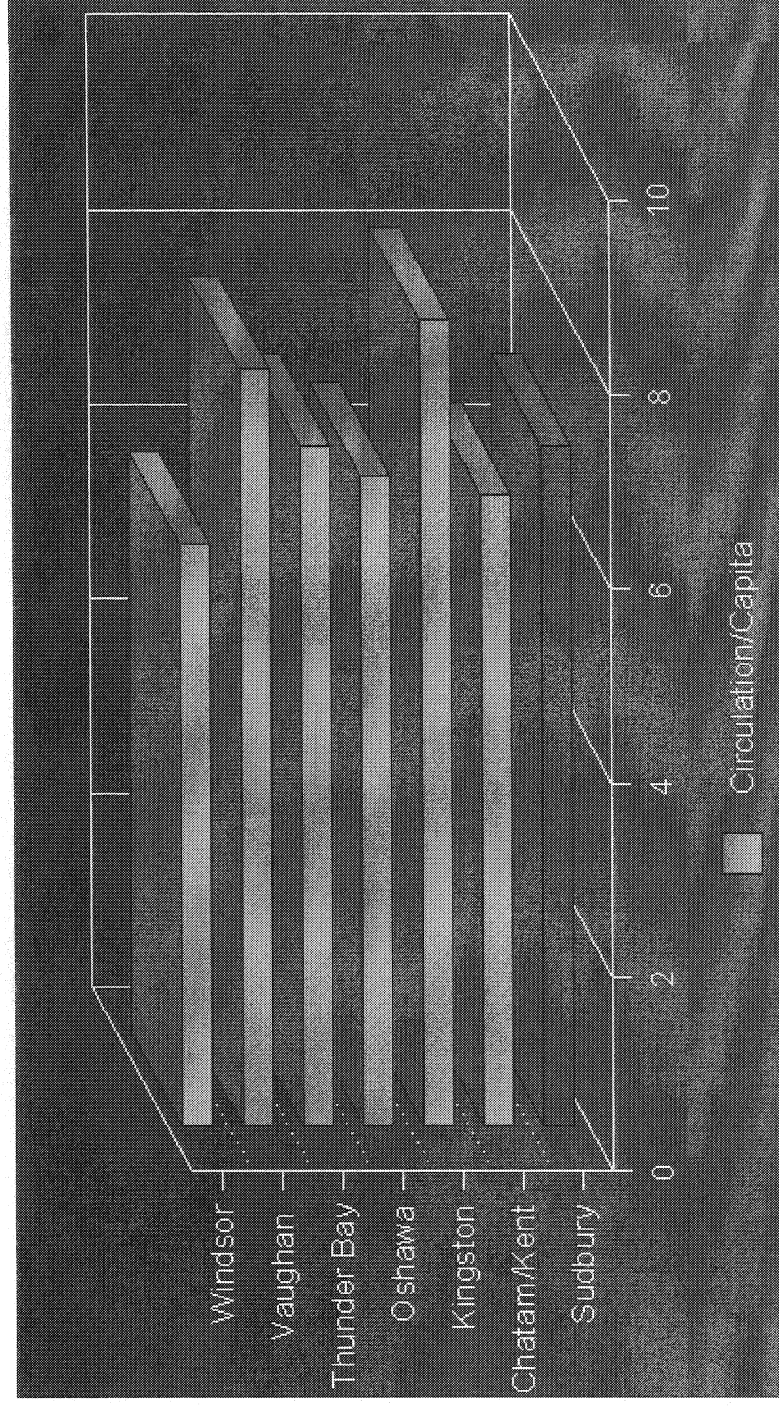
Greater Sudbury Public Library

Extremely well used system

- Free and transparent access to 600,000 items located throughout the 13 branch system to all residents free of charge
 - ▶ Free delivery within a few days to the branch of choice
- Homebound service
- Free internet through 92 public computers
- Library website that brings the library into your home

Recent Initiatives/Accomplishments

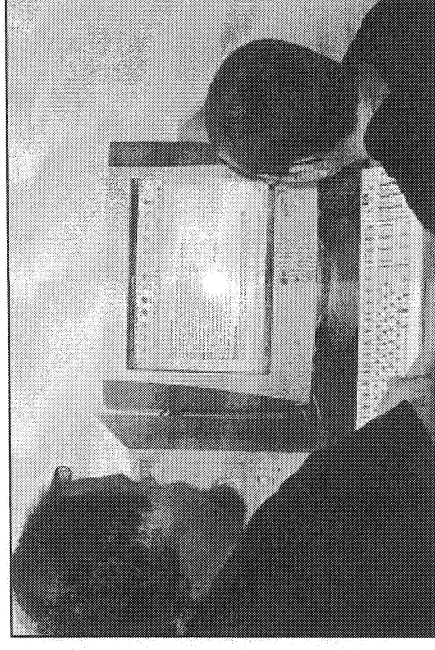
- Partnership with Transit to provide transportation to school children to visit libraries

Recent Initiatives/Accomplishments

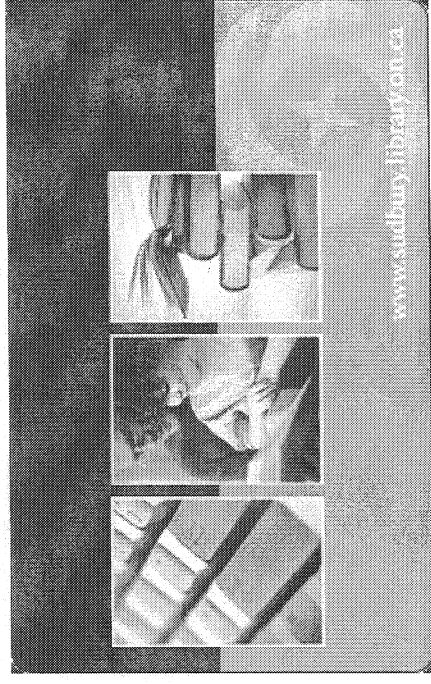
- Acquisition of the Gilardo and Miron photographic collection

Citizen Service Centres

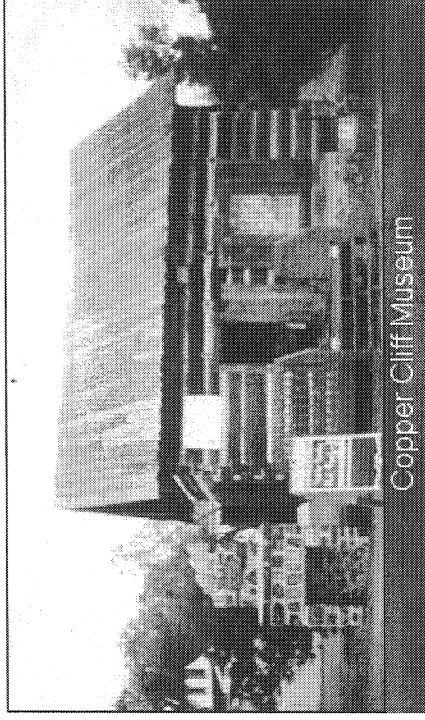
Recent Initiatives/Accomplishments

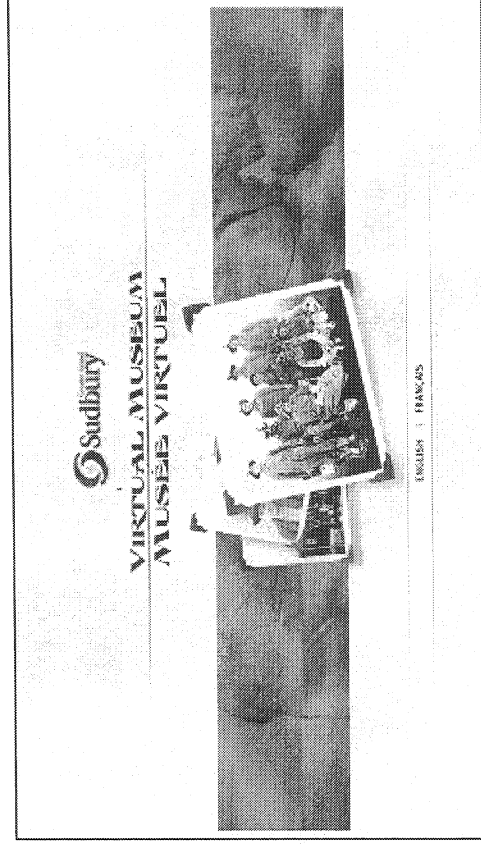
Mandate

Bowland Axe

- John Bowland on first survey crew in 1883 that founded Sudbury
 - ▶ Worked for Chief Engineer William Ramsey
- Bowland's axe presented to Sudbury Town Council June 8, 1921
- Axe entrusted to Art Gallery of Sudbury
 - ▶ In 2006, Art Gallery agrees to return axe to the City
- The axe to be exhibited in the CPR train station this summer and then at Mackenzie Library

Activities (May 21 – 27)

- Employee appreciation visits by Councillors and Senior Management
- B.B.Q. and equipment display – Frobisher Depot
 - Saturday, May 27, 2006
 - Open to Council, Senior Management, Public Works employees and their immediate families
- Recycling centre tours

What Does Public Works Do?

- Five basic divisions under Public Works
 - Engineering & Construction – G. Clausen
 - Roads/Drainage & Transportation – R. Falcioni
 - Sewer/Water & Plants – N. Benkovich
 - Assets & Solid Waste – D. Braney
 - Strategic Support Services – M.B. Gibbons

- Public Works is a highly visible department within the City of Greater Sudbury due to impact on all citizens daily.

Engineering & Construction

- In house design of roads/sewer & water
 - Design for water treatment plants & sewage treatment plants are generally handled by specialist consultants
- Landfill site closures & capping of completed cells
- Tendering & construction of capital works projects related to the above
- Construction supervision, inspection & materials testing, and surveying services

Roads, Drainage & Transportation (Operational)

- **Road maintenance (summer)**
 - Ditch cleaning/weed control
 - Repair/replacement of guide rails
 - Shouldering
 - Removal of sand from winter control
 - Brushing
 - Traffic signal maintenance
 - Line painting
 - Street lighting (in conjunction with G.S.U.)

Roads, Drainage & Transportation (Operational)

- **Road Maintenance (Winter)**
 - Snow plowing
 - Snow removal
 - Salting/sanding
 - Ditch clearing (for spring run off)
 - Culvert steaming
 - Pot hole repair
 - 3,521 lane km of roads

Sewer, Water & Plants (Operational)

■ Water supply

- Operate and maintain 17 water supply wells
 - 9 in Valley East
 - 3 in Capreol
 - 3 in Garson
 - 2 in Dowling
- Operate and maintain 2 surface source water supplies
 - Wahnapiatae – chemically assisted gravity filter
 - David Street – membrane filter

Sewer, Water & Plants (Operational)

■ Wastewater Treatment

- Operate and maintain 9 sewage treatment plants
- Operate and maintain 4 lagoon systems
- Operate and maintain 76 sewage lift (pumping) stations

Sewer, Water & Plants (Operational)

- **Water Distribution and Collection**
 - Provide operation and maintenance of:
 - 886 km of water mains
 - 723 km of sewer mains
 - Hydrants
 - Valves (water mains)
 - Winter conditions and extreme frost depths in certain years cause water main breaks and frozen services

Assets & Solid Waste

- Assets Management
 - Real Estate
 - Property acquisition
 - Expropriations
 - Disposal of surplus property
 - Capital Projects
 - New buildings/additions
 - Emergency repairs

Assets & Solid Waste

- Building Maintenance (New Section)
 - Currently developing standards for building maintenance/management, i.e.
 - Tom Davies Square
 - Provincial building
 - Farmer's market
 - Lionel Lalonde Centre
 - Former police building
 - Former Valley East town hall
 - Section manages approximately 600 buildings

Solid Waste Management

- **Operation and maintenance of four landfill sites:**
 - **Sudbury**
 - **Walden**
 - **Rayside Balfour**
 - **Valley East**

Solid Waste Management

- Waste diversion (recycling)
 - Recycling centre
 - Hazardous waste depot
 - Sudbury landfill site composting
- Collection of household hazardous waste and blue box
 - Pilot project to collect organics (kitchen waste) 2006

Strategic Support Services

- Management of capital and non-capital inventory
- IES fleet management (approx. 800 vehicles not including Fire or Police)
- Infrastructure – dispatch/customer service
- IES Finance (payroll, invoices, and budgets)
- IES claims and contracts
- Performance measurement, benchmarking, internal reviews
- Technological based solutions
