- P Council meeting September 8, 2004
- PRecommendation to hire Consultant to prepare feasibility study for the relocation of EMS and Police at CLELC
- P Consultant's report submitted November 30, 2004

Considerations

P<u>EMS</u>

- Lease expired at McFarlane Lake Complex
- Primary Operations Centre
 - Estimated one-time cost avoidance: \$410,000

P Fire Service

- Azilda Fire Station in poor state of repair
- Training more centralized and productive
- Administration will benefit from integration with EMS
 - Estimated one-time cost avoidance: \$1,265,000
 - Estimated annual on-going cost avoidance: \$293,000

P Police Service

- Requirement for storage
- Operational No.2 Station
- Existing storefronts poor state of repair
- Collision Reporting Centre
- Shared Services
 - Estimated one-time cost avoidance: \$1,000,000
 - Estimated annual on-going cost avoidance: \$180,000

PEOC

- Primary EOC at Tom Davies Square
- Secondary EOC at Frobisher Depot
- Both insufficient to meet disaster integrated requirements

PCLELC

- Perfect location:
 - geography, security, housing accommodation
- Ample room to expand

P Gymnasium

- Main aerobic area
- Members use for walking/jogging in winter
- Fitness classes in evenings
- Basketball, volleyball & badminton
 - Investment in Azilda to compensate for loss of gym: \$1,500,000

P Residential growth

- ► Watermain upgrade needed for fire protection
- Estimated cost: \$420,000.00
- Benefit abutting properties
- Encourage development in the area
- ▶ \$105,000 to be recovered from abutting owners

P Economic spin-offs

- Increased workforce at CLELC
- New partnerships






NYB Option A (20 vehicles) new wing- \$6,700,250 Growth for 10 years +/- with gym




NYB Option B (20 vehicles) gym + addition - \$5,933,000 Growth for 10 years +/- no gym




Staff Option 1 (14 vehicles) new wing - \$6,200,250 No growth with gym

Budget Impact

- P Staff Option 1: Increase per year \$212,900
 - Cost to taxpayer*: \$2.36
- P Staff Option 2: Increase per year \$94,000
 - Cost to taxpayer: \$1.04
- P Staff Option 3: Increase per year \$77,800
 - ► Cost to taxpayer: \$0.86
- P NYB Option A: Increase per year \$283,500
 - Cost to taxpayer: \$3.15
- P NYB Option B: Increaser per year \$158,800
 - Cost to taxpayer: \$1.76

^{*}for each \$100,000 of assessed value

Budget Impact

With cross border funding

P Should cross border funding be available, (assuming \$1.5 million), annual budget impact can be further reduced, if the gym is left intact.

PStaff Option 1A: \$73,300 or \$0.81/taxpayer

PNYB Option A1: \$143,000 or \$1.60/taxpayer
