Background:

A letter dated September 1, 2006 was received from Mr. K. Edwards, Vice-President, Operations, Pioneer Construction requesting an exemption to Chapter 776 of the former City of Sudbury Municipal Code (Noise By-law) for Contract 2006-16 Kingsway Four Laning.

Background:

A letter dated September 20, 2006 was received from Mr. M. Sinclair, Hinds & Sinclair, on behalf of INCO Limited requesting an exemption to Noise By-law 93-424 of the former Town of Walden for the site preparation and construction activities for the Totten Mine project, which is located on the south side of MR 4 (Fairbank Lake Road) in the former townsite of Worthington.

INCO Limited has stated that construction is proposed to be around the clock from September 29, 2006 to December 31, 2006. By-law 93-424 prohibits "any unnecessary noise arising between the hour of eight o'clock p.m. of any day and seven o'clock a.m. of the next following day from any excavation or construction work whatsoever including the erection, demolition, alteration or repair of any building...", therefore, the exemption would be for the hours of 8:00 p.m. of any day and 7:00 a.m. of the next following day.
