BACKGROUND

The office supplies contract is highly service oriented where the vendor is expected to deliver directly to 135 city end users and have a computerized electronic ordering system. Also, the successful vendor is required to have adequate warehouse facilities in Sudbury with experienced and trained staff with their own delivery service to meet all our requirements.

The following RFP Evaluation Grid Criteria was used to evaluate the proponents:

The RFP closed on January 2nd, 2008 and the following two proponents submitted proposals:

Corporate Express Canada Inc. Grand & Toy Ltd.

Both proponents are located in Sudbury with warehouse and delivery service which was part of the pre-qualification to bid.

The Evaluation Committee consisted of:

Ed Stankiewicz, Manager of Financial Planning and Policy Leigh Lesar, Supplies and Services Co-ordinator Darryl Mathé, Manager of Supplies and Services / Purchasing Agent

The Evaluation Committee evaluated Corporate Express Canada Inc. the highest at 96 points and Grand & Toy Ltd. at 92 points.

Corporate Express Canada Inc. also had the lowest prices. The total quoted prices were based on a two-year average consumption. For Corporate Express Canada Inc., we took into consideration items not bid on and their prices being firm for six months and last six months based on a CPI increase:

Corporate Express Canada Inc. is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Corporate Express NV, one of the world's largest business-to-business supplier of office products. Corporate Express Canada has facilities across Canada, including Sudbury. On August 2nd, 2007, Corporate Express Canada Inc. purchased Davenport Office Inc. (operated as Basics Office Products).

Muirheads was part of the Basics Office Products group before it was purchased by Grand & Toy in May of 2005. Basic Office Products opened up a warehouse in 2006 and, as noted, was purchased by Corporate Express.

Office supplies under this contract includes pens, pencils, erasers, staplers, folders and binders, which are better known as stationery items. It does not include paper, which is a separate contract coordinated with our Sudbury Regional Buying Group. Also not included is office furniture, work stations (Technion), printed envelopes and letterhead.

Savings per year with Corporate Express Canada Inc. is \$30,361.14 and total savings for the contract period by six years would total \$182,166.84.

All Corporate Express distribution facilities are ISO 9001:2000 certified. Corporate Express Canada Inc. is rated in the top 50 employers in Canada (the only company in office supplies to achieve award).

RECOMMENDATION

The Evaluation Committee recommends Corporate Express Canada Inc. having the highest rated score of 96 points for a three-year term (2008-2010) with option for an additional three years subject to negotiations favourable to both parties. The average cost of the contract will be \$198,955.91 per year with an annual yearly increase based on CPI starting in the second year.

Background

As a measure to address the shortage of family medicine practitioners the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care in 2005 announced funding for the development of the City of Lakes Family Health Team. Through a partnership with the Hôpital Régional Sudbury Regional Hospital, the Northern Ontario School of Medicine and the City of Greater Sudbury each has contributed to this initiative by means of in-kind support, infrastructure and clinical teaching. The four sites allocated to the development are: Pioneer Manor, and the former town halls in Valley East, Rayside Balfour and Walden.

The Ministry of Health and Long Term Care is also committed to the development of the infrastructure through a 50/50 cost share with the City of Greater Sudbury.

Former Town Hall in Valley East

The estimated cost to renovate the main floor of the Valley East site was \$244,000. Tenders were opened by the Tender Opening Committee for the Valley East Site Interior Renovations on January 15, 2008 with a total of seven (7) contractors who submitted a bid. The lowest tenderer was Kona Builders Ltd. at a total contract price of \$254,772.85. However, the contractor failed to meet the 48 hours provided to complete the "Fair Wage Policy Compliance Form" pursuant to procedures 3c as well as the City's Purchasing By-law 2006-270, as amended and as a result was disqualified.

It is therefore recommended that Council award the contract to Prosperi Plastering Co. Ltd. being the lowest compliant bidder in the total contract amount of \$256,692.

Funding

There is a difference of \$1,919.15 between the two bids. This project, as with all of the sites, will share a 50/50 cost between the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care and the City of Greater Sudbury. The cost to the City of Greater Sudbury will be \$128,346 and funds are available to cover the leasehold improvements through monies dedicated to turnkey clinics.

City of Lakes Family Health Team - Valley Site

The intent is to have this site operational by this spring. There is currently one new physician who has committed to practising at this location with space to accommodate two more.
