#### **BACKGROUND**

Attached is a letter dated 2006-09-23 submitted by Mr. Patrick Carmichael, President, on behalf of The Royal Canadian Legion Branch 224 requesting Council's approval for an exemption from Chapter 776 of the former City of Sudbury Municipal Code (Noise By-law) to operate a hospitality area in their rear parking lot at 41 Veterans Road, Copper Cliff.

The request is made to facilitate an October Fest and Halloween function on Saturday, October 28, 2006 from 8:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. with an anticipated attendance of approximately two hundred (200) people.

In accordance with Council's policy, this application was circulated to the City Solicitor, Fire Chief, Chief of Emergency Medical Services, Manager of By-law Enforcement Services, Acting Manager of Transportation Engineering Services, Director of Transit Services, and the Executive Officer to the Chief of Police, Greater Sudbury Police. No response has been received from the various departments.

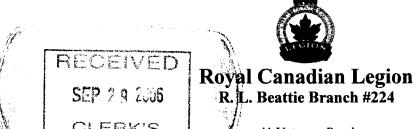
#### SCHEDULE 'A'

#### **CONDITIONS:**

- 1. That the special event organizer shall ensure the provision of adequate clean-up of the site and those properties adjacent to the event immediately following the event;
- 2. That the event representative ensure emergency vehicles have access to the event area and that barricades be set up to ensure crowd control;
- 3. That all Ontario Fire Code regulations must be adhered to, in particular, with respect to Section 2.8 that indicates a Fire Safety Plan is required for this event;
- 4. That no bonfires of any kind, barbecues or similar types of cooking devices shall be operated on the site without the consent of the Fire Chief, and that an approved fire extinguisher be provided for each of the foregoing;
- 5. That no glassware be permitted outside the premises;
- 6. That no outside entertainment system be permitted, however, if outdoor amplified sound equipment is in use, all speakers and speaker stacks shall be positioned to tilt downward into the crowd versus projecting straight over the crowd or adjoining properties;
- 7. That the special event organizer, or his designate, must be present on the site during the entire duration of the event.
- 8. That any tent be erected in accordance with the provisions of the Ontario Building Code.
- 9. The event organizer shall notify the neighbours and provide the City Clerk with a copy of said notification.

#### Dear Sir/Madam

The Royal Canadian Legion Branch #224 is submitting information of an outdoor event being planned for the 28<sup>th</sup> October 2006.

We are requesting approval of the City Council to host such an event. This will be an October Fest and Halloween function to be held in the rear parking at 41 Veterans Road, Copper Cliff, this being the property of the Legion Branch. We have made application to the Alcohol and Gaming Commission for outdoor licencing from 8:00 o'clock p.m. to 1:00 o'clock a.m.(29<sup>th</sup> October 2006).

This area is situated on the north side of the building with the INCO agriculture facility and plant parking lots (as accessed from Garrow Street and Benjafield Road) to the north east and north. The Copper Cliff Curling Club and McClelland Arena are situated to the west. With respect to the licencing of the parking lot area we have designated an area of 609.20 square meters with designated areas for the bar, fire, barbeque.

Fencing will be erected to enclose the designated area with an entrance/exit and available emergency access. There is no intention to erect tents in the area.

With past events hosted we have sought approval for a Noise By-law exemption with scheduled entertainment (music) for outdoors. Due to the in climate weather we have experienced at our past two events we have had to move such entertainment indoors, for this event the entertainment will be indoors. We do however, request consideration for a noise by-law exemption for the outdoor bonfire activities.

In the past years we have hosted a number of outdoor events which have been very successful with the attendance of the community and regular patrons. The events have been held without incident.

With past events we have experienced an attendance of up to two hundred and would again expect such turnout throughout the evening.

The appropriate notices are forwarded to the Fire and Police Services, and to the Health Unit. Application is being made for a fire permit.

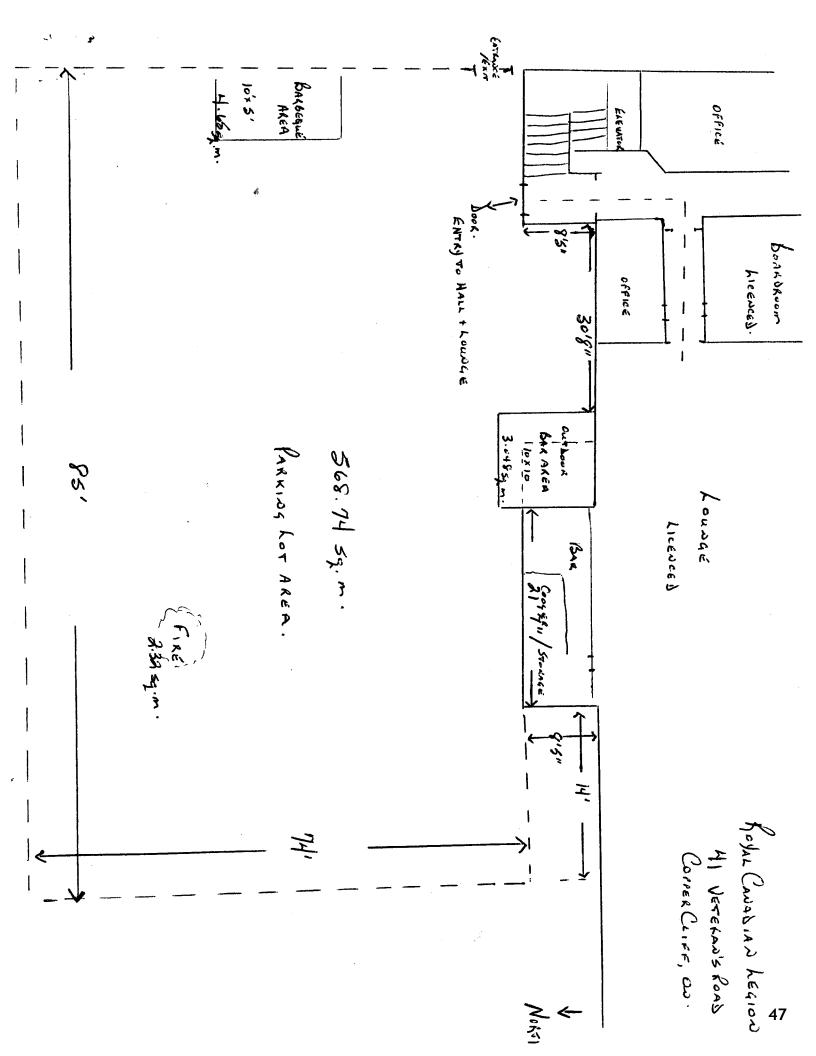
