There are two issues regarding the community of Beaver Lake that I would like to present to you for your consideration and help in resolution.

The first issue is the closing of the Welcome Centre. I returned from winter vacation to "incidentally" discover that the Welcome Centre in Beaver Lake is closed. The manner in which this occurred is unknown to any of the residents in the area. I have been told by you that the "cost to maintain it" is too high.

This welcome center is the first municipal facility in the City of Greater Sudbury when traveling from west to east, and it receives approximately 200 visitors on a daily basis during the peak summer months. During the off months, there are 40 - 50 stops there daily. We have monitored this building for two years and have personally, and community wide, cleaned garbage, and kept the site appealing to visitors to the area.

The Beaver Lake Sports and Cultural Club, through the membership has requested that I write to you requesting that the centre remain open, and be kept clean and representative of our area.

The second issue is that of the internet service, and high speed access through Bell Sympatico. As we have discussed before, I have a petition signed by two hundred residents wanting high speed internet access. I forwarded this petition to Bell Sympatico last November 06 for their review with a request for the upgraded telephone system to support high speed internet access. I have received a letter from Bell indicating that they will not be entertaining the improvement in our area in the near future. The "solutions report" by Floyd Laughren group has recommended that the City of Greater Sudbury provides equal access for all residents in the City of Greater Sudbury.

I would like to request on behalf of the Beaver Lake residents that the Walden Can, you, and the mayors office endorse our efforts to have access to high speed internet, either through the City IT process, and, or Bell Sympatico.

I will be presenting these two issues to the "priorities" meeting on May 02.07.

Recommendations:

Reopen the Welcome Center in Beaver Lake with appropriate funding to support and maintain the center year round.



Report for Walden Can for May 07.

Activities:

The Beaver Lake Club is very busy this spring. We have several baby showers, wedding showers, and a few Anniversary celebrations.
On May 11,12/07 we are hosting our Spring Fair with a craft sale, flea market and bake table.

We are proud to be participating in the Juhannus Festival on June 23,24.07. This is the Finnish Celebration that is being hosted by the Finnish Society of the City of Greater Sudbury. It is an annual event that rotates around Canada and some parts of the United States. We will be open the entire weekend and offering our famous finn pancake breakfast , afternoon coffee with Finn music by Iona Reed. The club will be set up as a Museum offering various finnish relics, finnish deserts and paintings by local finnish artists. We will be part of the bus tour from Sudbury.

The Beaver Lake Fall Fair is scheduled for September 28,29.07 and the high light is the Antique Auction and Steak Dinner on Saturday (29).

Issues:

We are working collectively with the City of Greater Sudbury, Walden Can, and our councilor Jacques Barbeau to reopen our welcome center. This facility is an integral part of our community, and it is the first municipal facility to greet visitors to the Sudbury region when traveling from west to east along highway 17 E, and it is the only rest area from the French River going west along highway 69, the 17 bipass for Sudbury, to Nairn Centre. We see this center as an opportunity for visitors to see Beaver Lake for a moment, have a rest stop, and use the facilities. This also helps to deter waste being thrown alongside the highway.

We are also working to obtain access to high speed internet from Bell Sympatico. The existing telephone system in our area is out dated, and some phone lines are still party lines and thus have no 911 access . ie the Beaver Lake Club phone. I have collected a petition from are residents with 200 names and forwarded this to Bell Sympatico. They have rejected our request to upgrade our system. So, I have asked the City of greater Sudbury and the Walden Can to endorse our request to Bell Sympatico.
