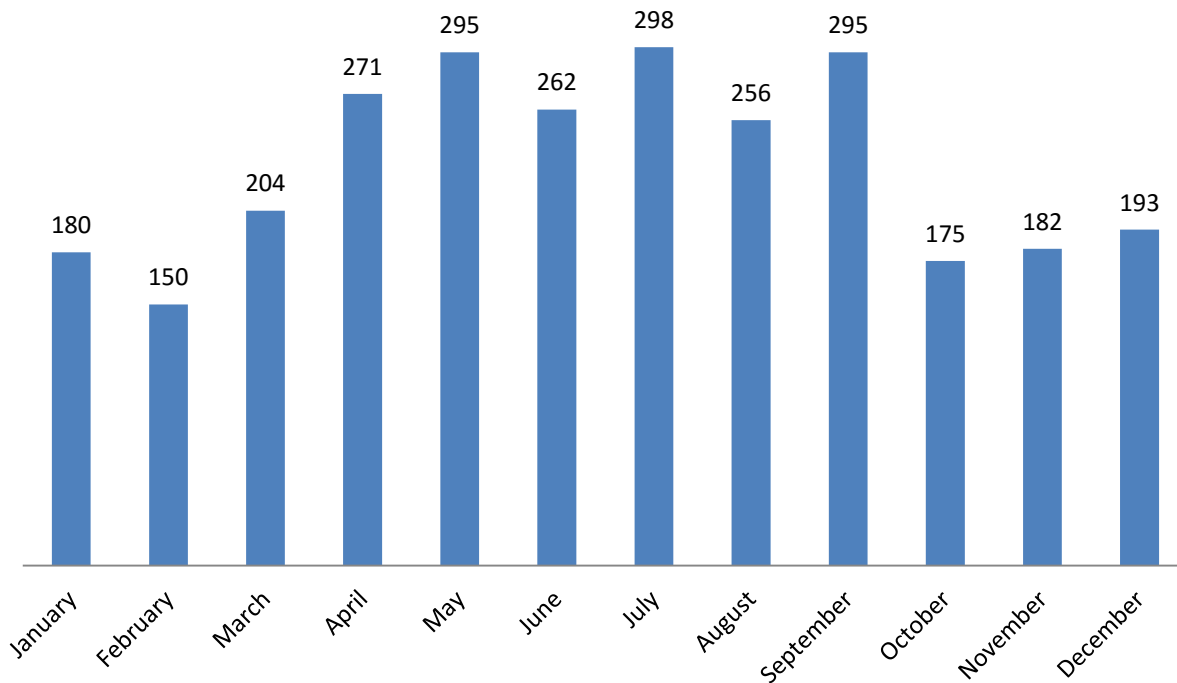

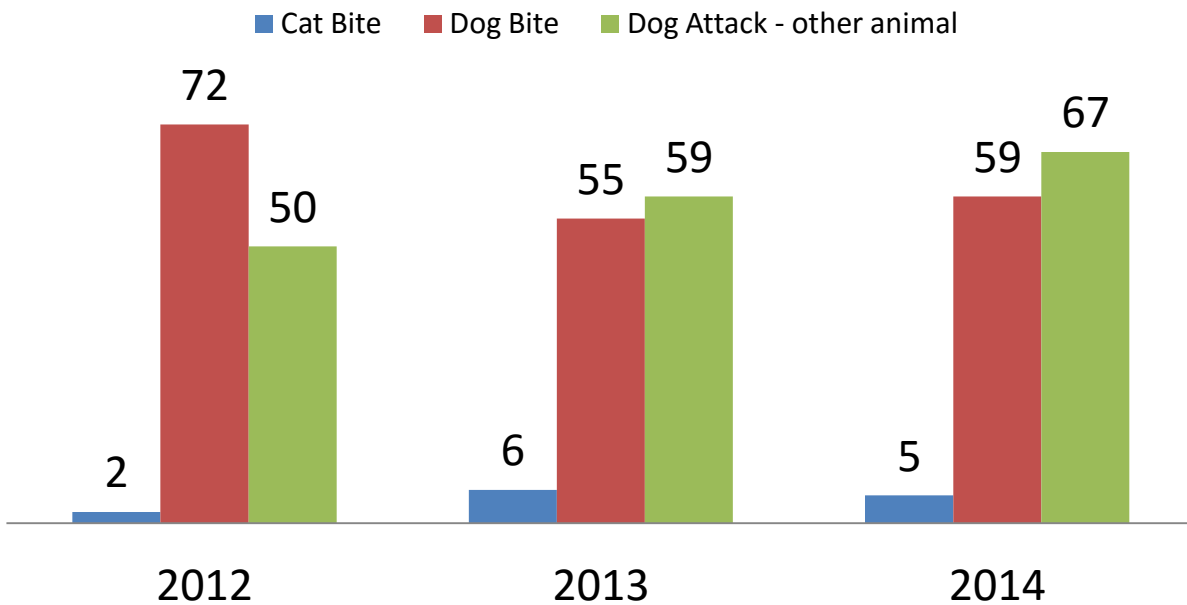

Breakdown of Total Number of Complaints



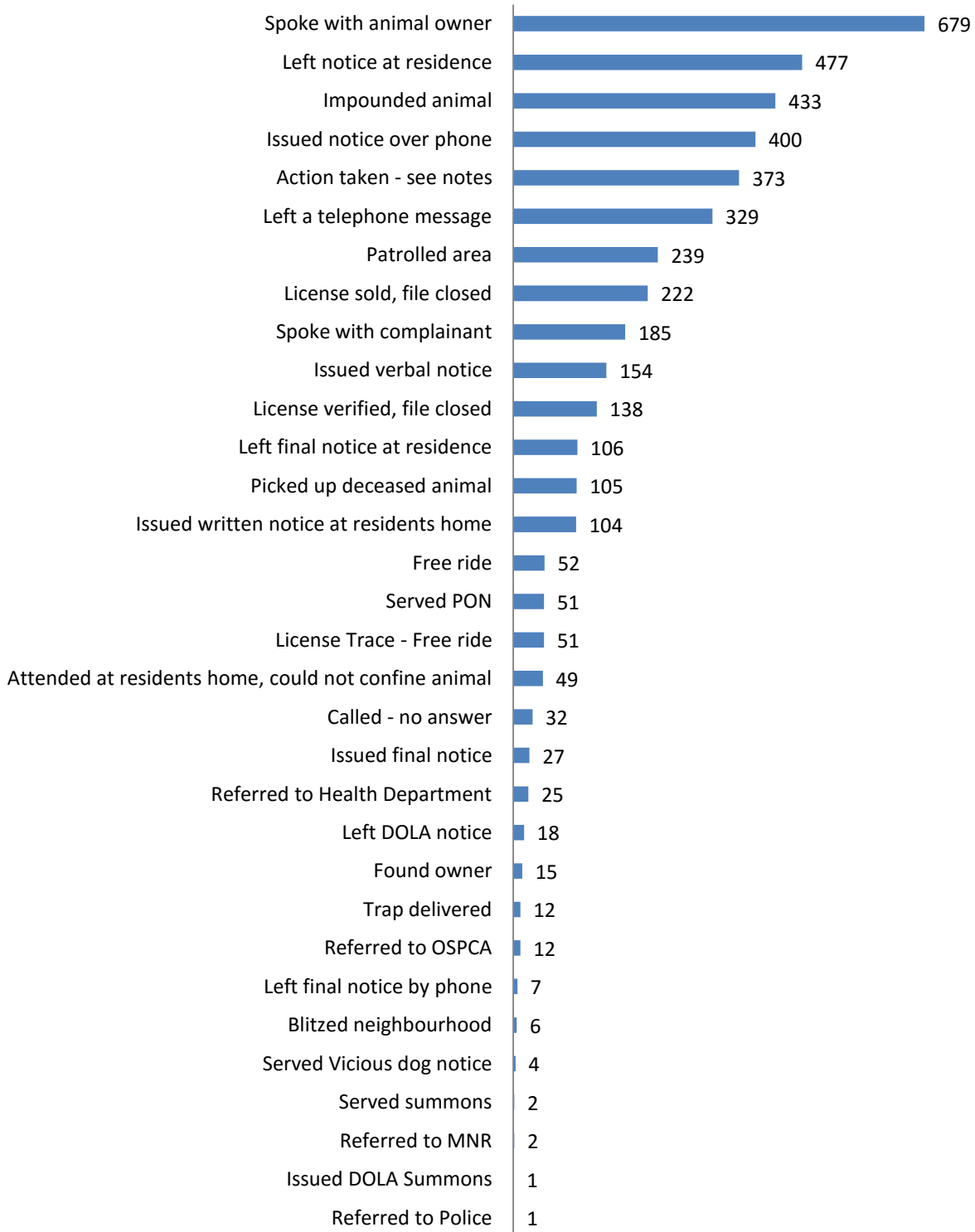
Cat and Dog Bites and Dog Attacks



The number of reported cat bites was five; we received 59 dog bite reports and 67 reports of dogs attacking other animals.



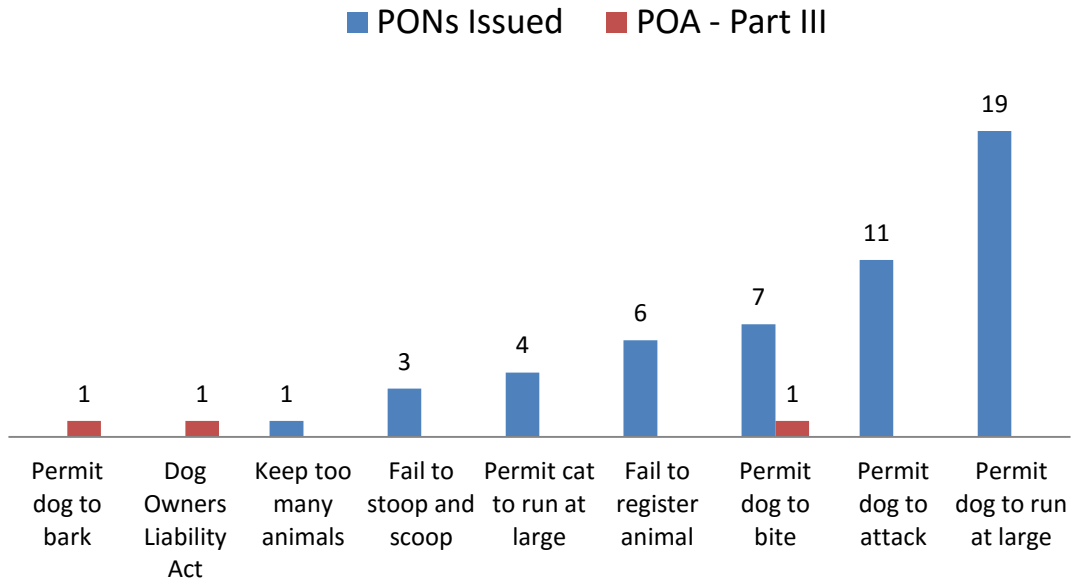
Enforcement Related Actions

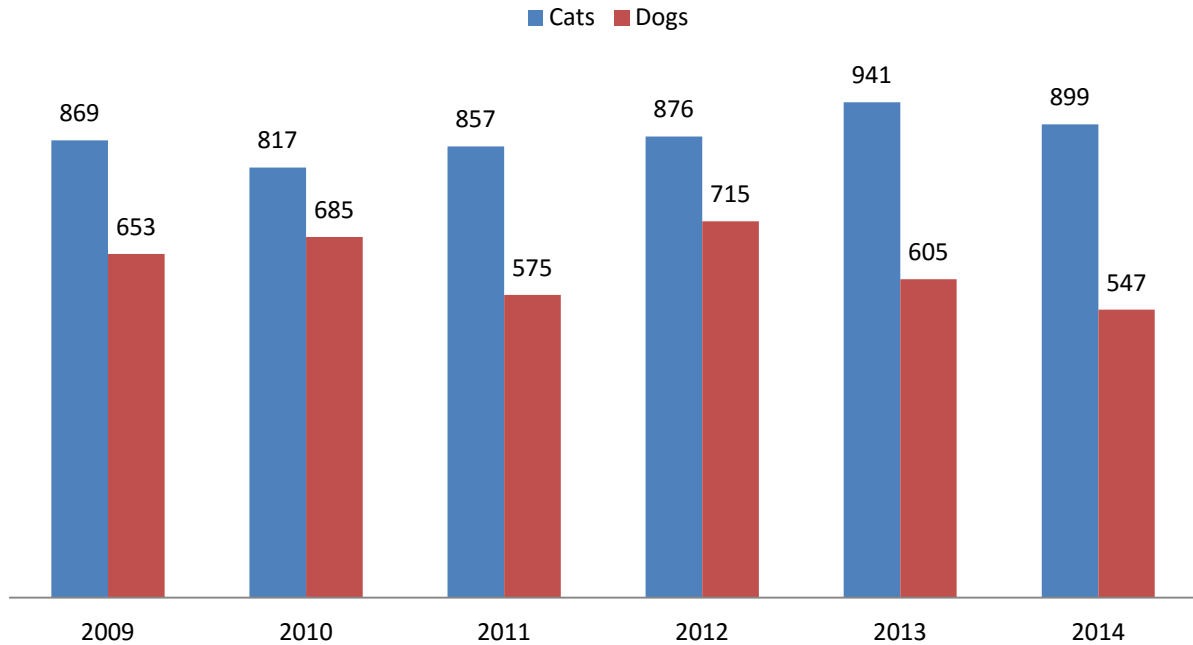


PONs and Summons Issued - 2014



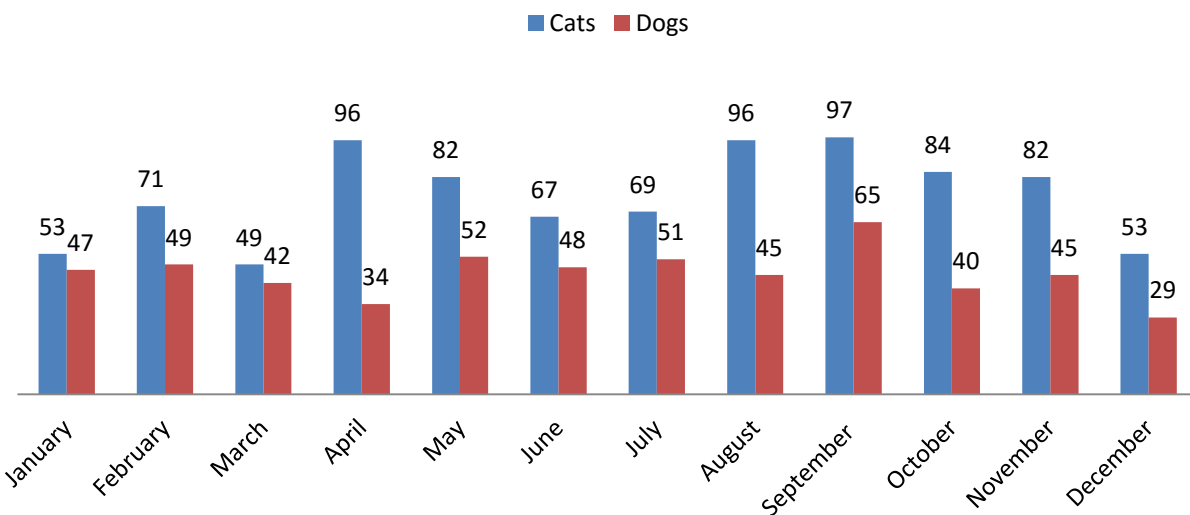


Total Dog and Cat Impounds



In total, 1,452 animals (899 Cats and 547 Dogs, two goats, one pig, two birds and one fish) were impounded in 2014 from the City of Greater Sudbury.

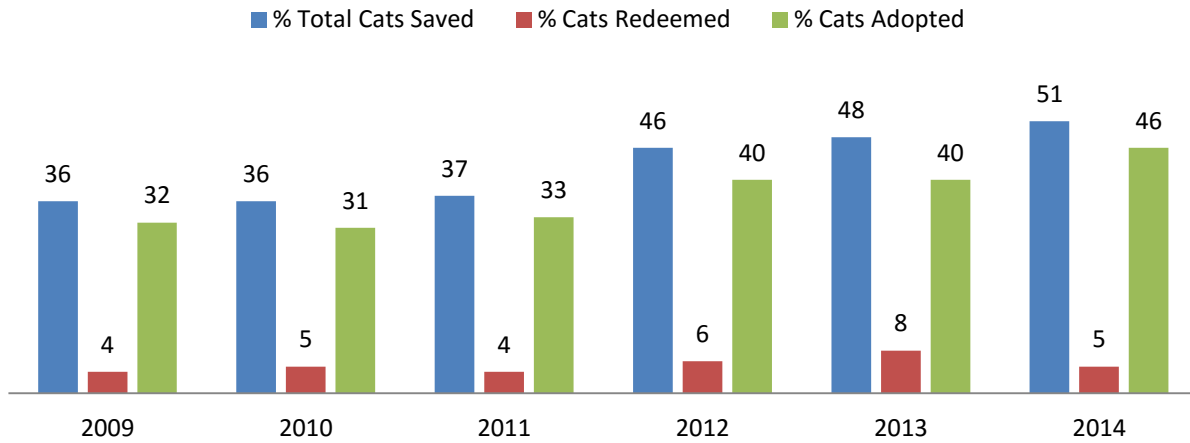
Animals Received



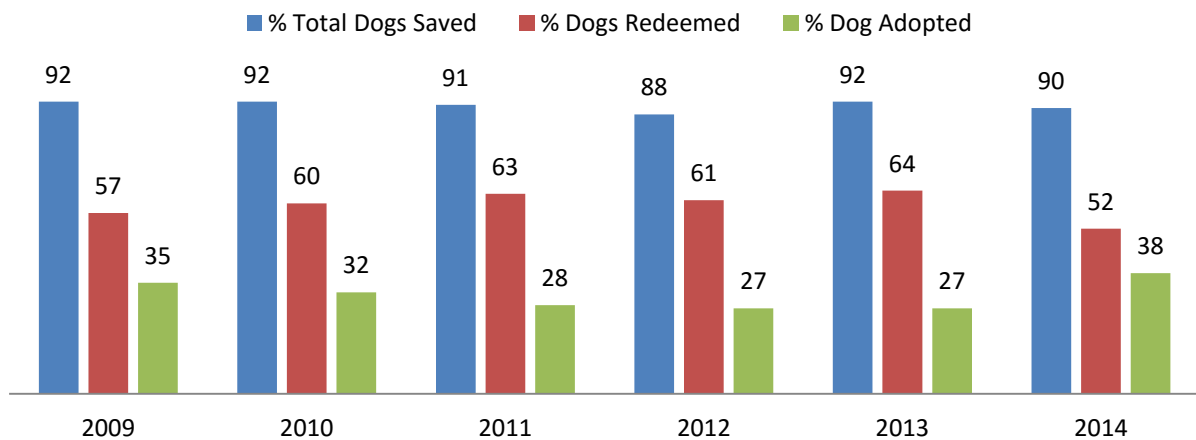
In addition to dogs and cats, Animal Control Officers picked up two stray goats and one stray pig that were transferred to the Sudbury and District OSPCA. The Shelter also received two birds and one fish that were adopted from the Shelter.

Dog Save Rate

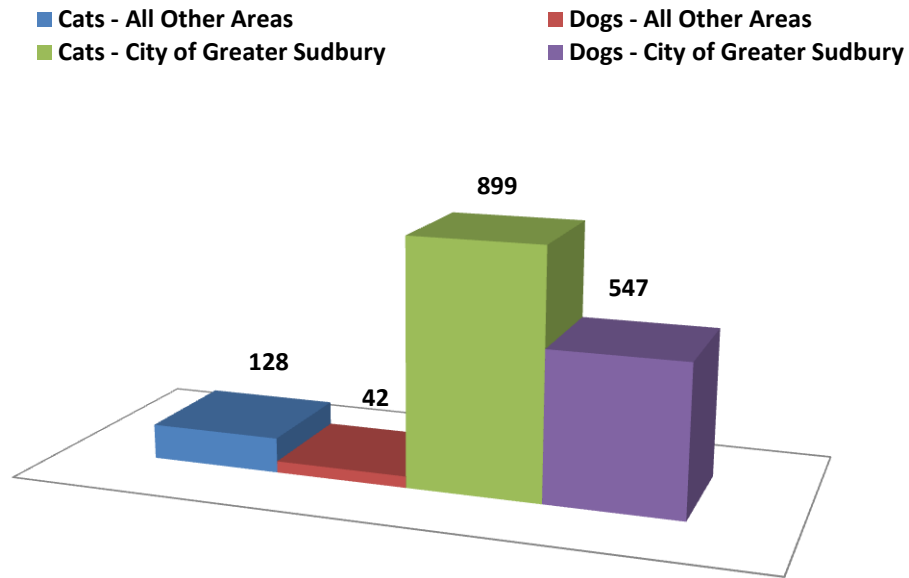


We are pleased to report that we are on track to have pushed our save rate for live cats to over 51%. Cat intake numbers remain high with 899 cats however, redemption rates remain low, (5%); the increase in the Save Rate being attributable to an increase in Cat Adoptions which is up to 46%; a 13% increase over 2009 numbers.

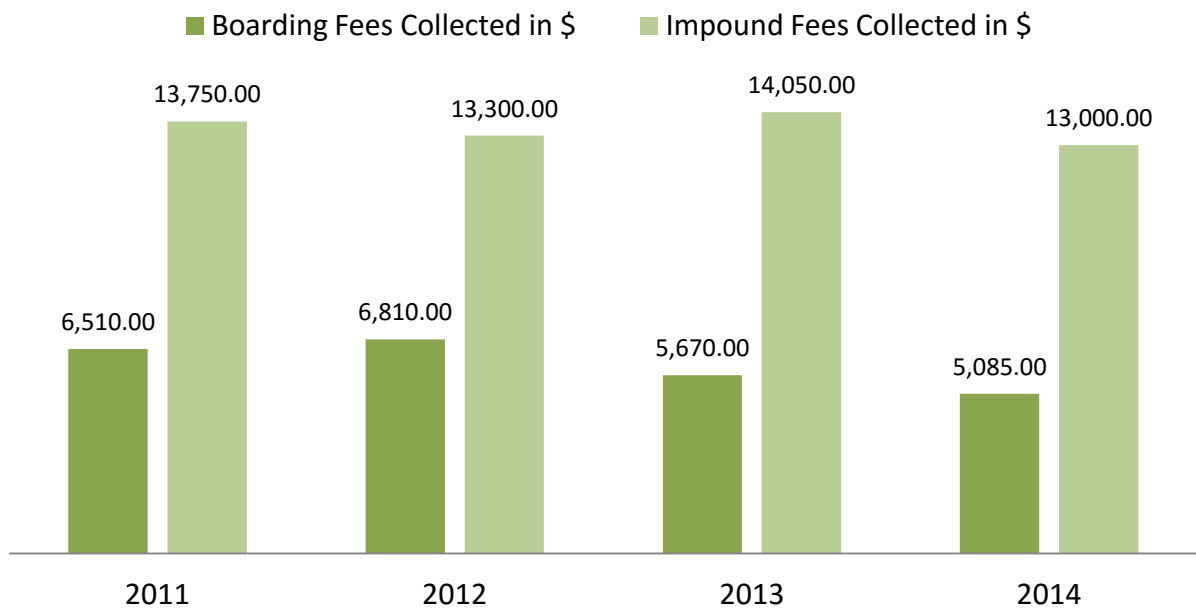
Dog intake rates continue to trend downwards with only 528 live dogs received in 2014, the lowest number since amalgamation. This is the long term trend with dog owners becoming ever more responsible with spay/neutering and other positive factors resulting in an overall more responsible attitude among the majority of dog owners. Locally we believe shelter diversion strategies such as enhancing the lost and found reporting mechanisms and working with the public and our partners through social media continues to reunite more and more dogs with their owners before they need to be impounded. The public lost and found reporting on www.rdshelter.ca is becoming the first place people look for lost and found pets.

Collected impound and boarding fees continue to decline. This is a result of the trend of less dog impoundments and subsequent redemptions and cat redemptions remaining low despite our best efforts to improve them.
