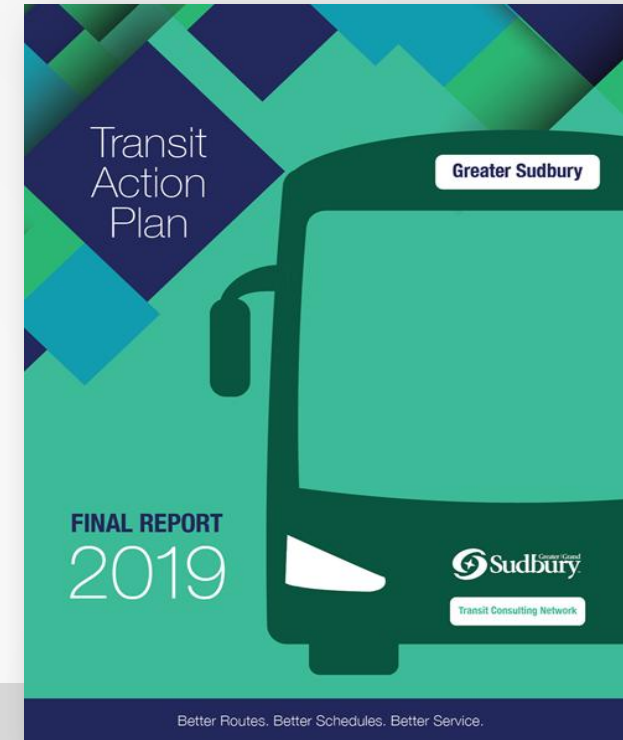

STRATEGIES ADDRESSING COMMUNITY PRIORITIES

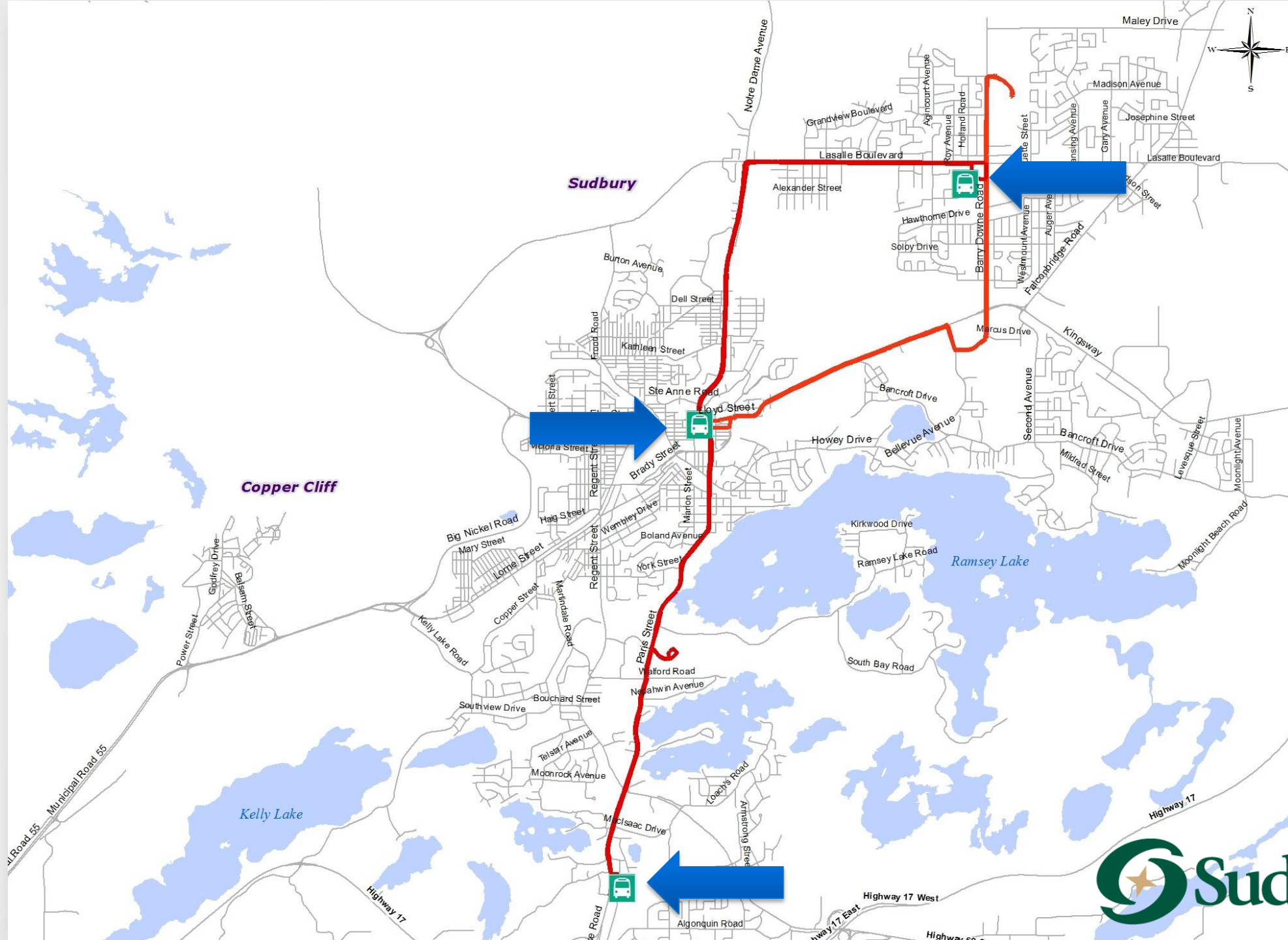
- High frequency routes on key corridors
- Fewer trips need to go Downtown
- System coordinates around three Mobility Hubs
- 27 routes, one network, 7 days/week
- Consistent and easier to understand
- Revised time points to improve reliability
- Timed transfers and seamless travel
- Service standards to match demand

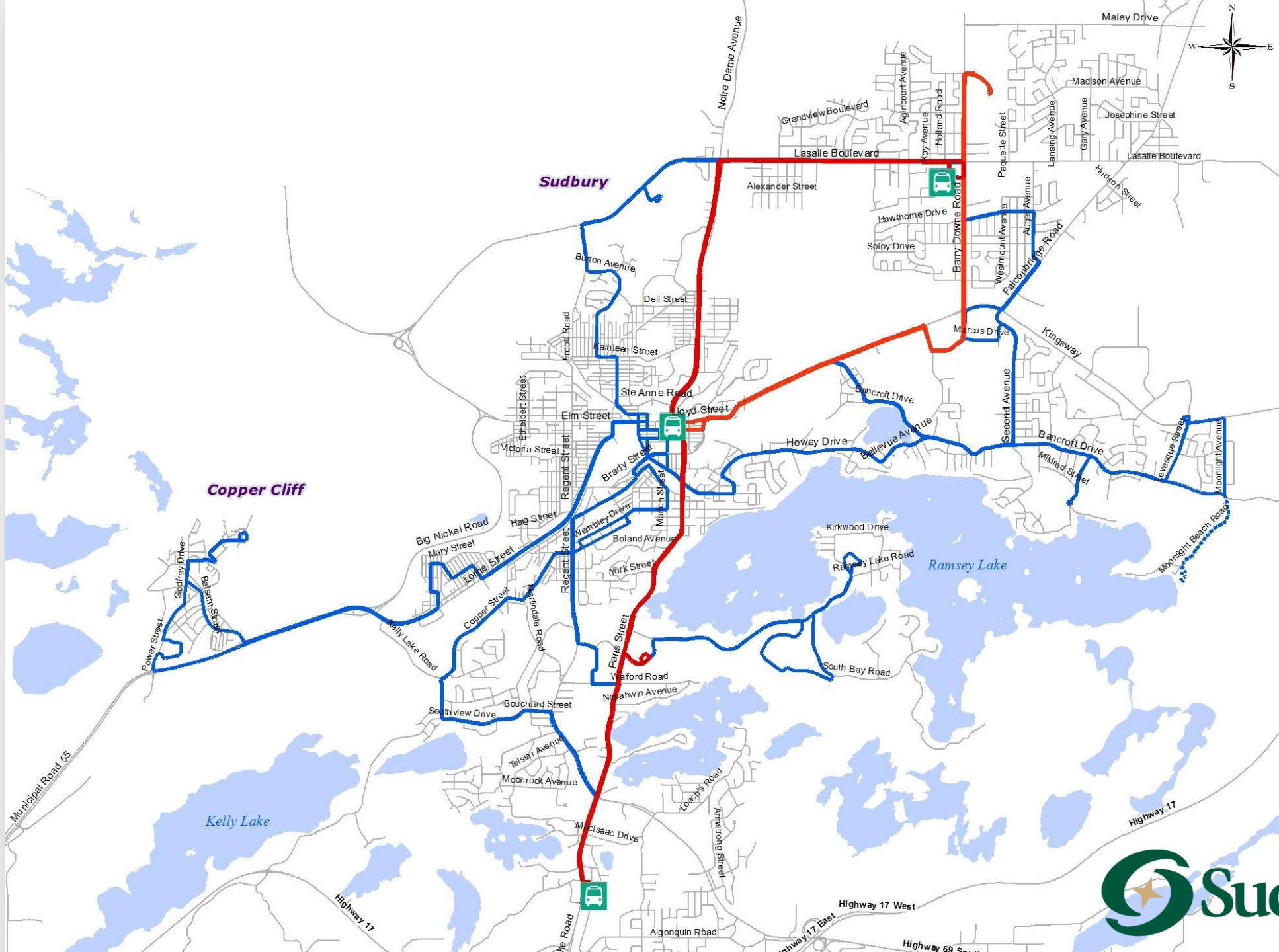

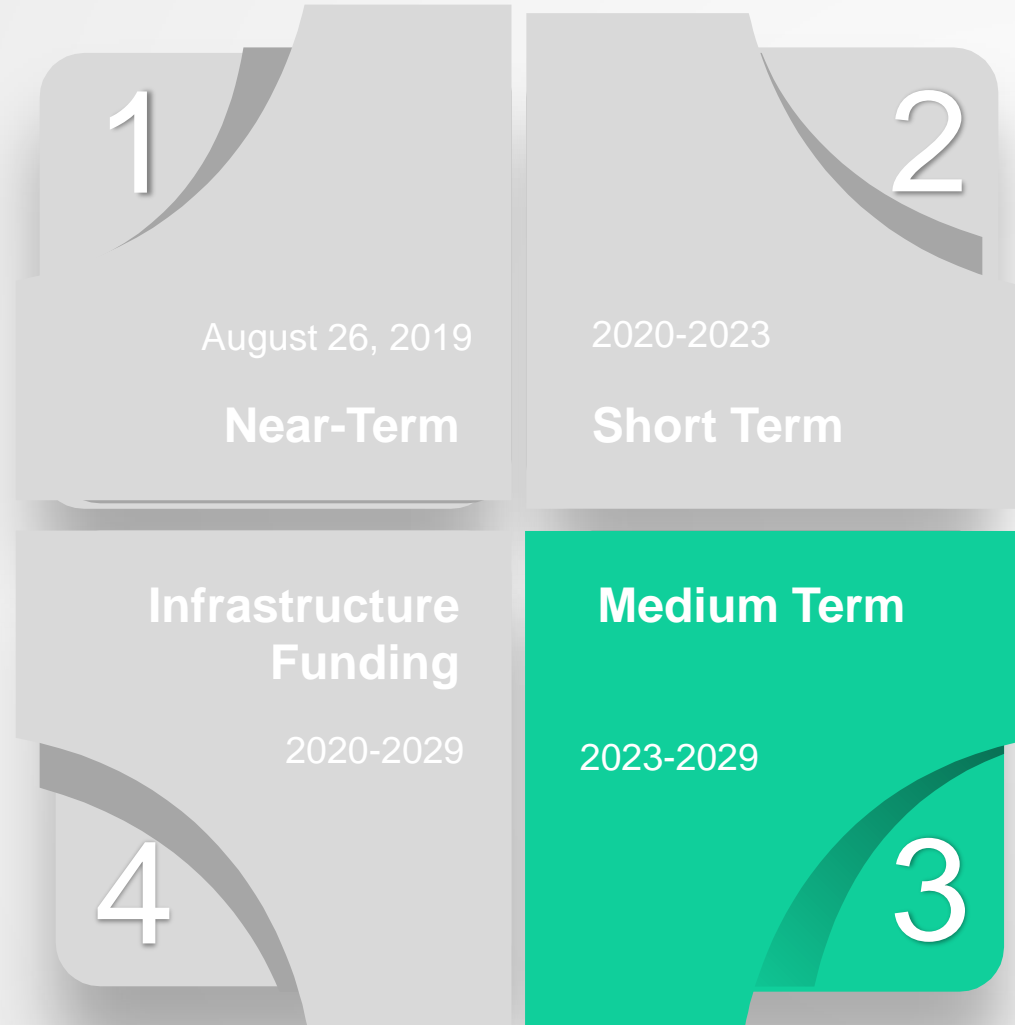

SHORT TERM SERVICE EXPANSION OPTIONS (1-3 YEARS)



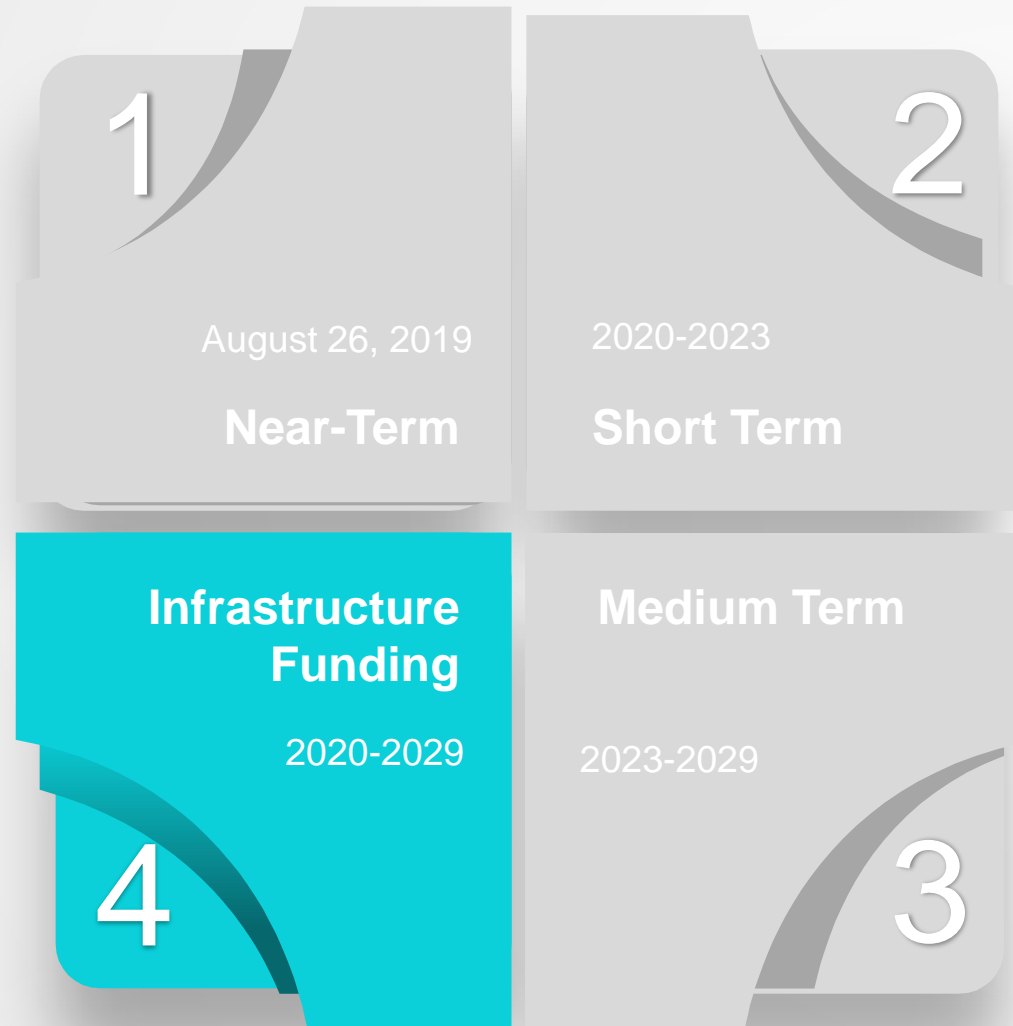
MEDIUM-TERM RECOMMENDATIONS

LONG TERM INFRASTRUCTURE BUS RAPID TRANSIT PRIORITY MEASURES



- ✓ Bus Rapid Transit means giving Transit the space and place it needs to be reliable and as timely as possible.
- ✓ Transit Priority Treatments can include priority signaling, queue jump lanes.
- ✓ Comfort stations, shelters, benches and wayfinding
